

40 Million Fire Extinguishers Recalled

Just recently a recall was announced involving 40 million fire extinguishers manufactured by Kidde. The recall involves 134 models of Kidde fire extinguishers manufactured between January 1, 1973 and August 15, 2017, including models that were previously recalled in March 2009 and February 2015. Be advised that some of the recalled extinguishers were sold under names other than Kidde (i.e. Fuller Brush, Honeywell, Montgomery Ward, Sears and other names).

Kidde Fire Extinguisher Product Safety Recall Information

Be advised that the link above has the list of recalled extinguishers. It also lets you submit your request for a replacement extinguisher after you provide your name, address, the model extinguisher and serial number. It verifies that your extinguisher is being recalled and submits your request for a replacement.

If you do not want to submit your request online, you can contact Kidde via telephone to find out if a fire extinguisher is included in the recall or to get a replacement.

Contact Kidde at 855-271-0773 between 8:30 a.m. and 5 p.m. EST Monday-Friday (excluding holidays), or between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. during the weekend to determine whether your extinguishers are affected.

Given how many AACA members have fire extinguishers for their vehicles, we have no doubt that some AACA members have extinguishers that are being recalled. Please take action on this situation immediately and be sure to share this information with all of your region and chapter members as soon as possible.


2018 Hershey Flea Market & Car Corral Pre-Registration Information

- Sign your pre-registration card(s) signifying that you have read the AACA and Hershey Region Regulations and Guidelines enclosed in your packet. Unsigned cards WILL BE returned.
- Scotch tape a copy of your 2018 AACA membership card in the space provided on the pre-registration card.
- If you are pre-registering both a Car Corral AND Flea Market space, please submit a separate check for each. We will not process your spaces if you do not comply with this request.
- DO NOT SEND MONEY FOR OR REQUEST ADDITIONAL FLEA MARKET OR CAR CORRAL SPACES. To request additional spaces, you will need to use the Activity Request Card that will come with your May/June 2018 issue of Antique Automobile magazine.




I.C. Kirkham Membership Award

New Zealand has been calling us for 35 years. In 1981, the Horseless Carriage Club (HCC) of Sonoma County, California, hosted a group of New Zealanders from the Horseless Carriage Club of New Zealand in Santa Rosa, California. The Redwood Empire Region of AACA was asked to help

house some of the visitors. Marilyn and I were asked to host Bob and Jan Cleave. They were our guests for a week or so. Each day we would meet the rest of the group and tour the many roads and places of interest in Sonoma County and other outlying areas.

We stayed in contact over the years with Christmas cards and letters, them always asking "When are you coming to New Zealand?" Well, 35 years later we finally made it there. Jan put us in touch with NZ Chauffeur Limited in Auckland. After a few emails, we were set for two weeks of chauffeur driven touring.

Upon our arrival, we spent three days with our old friends traveling the back roads around the very metropolitan Auckland and dining together. We visited the Auckland Veteran & Vintage Car Club (AVVCC). The AVVCC is one of 36 branches of the New Zealand Vintage Car Club (www.avvcc.org.nz). The aim of the Club is to cater for all types of vehicles over thirty years old. Barri Robert, the club historian, is a member of AACA. Before we left the states, I contacted National Headquarters and Pat Buckley checked the National Club roster and found Barri listed as a member of AACA. Bob was well acquainted with the Club and set up a meeting with Barri at the Club House. The AVVCC has one of the largest libraries of automobile memorabilia, including issues of Antique Automobile from years back as well as manuals, advertisements, etc... The library has the sliding cabinet like our AACA library has to utilize the confined space. The work shop out back has its own collection of memorabilia.

Then we were in the very capable hands of our chauffeur Pam. New Zealanders drive on the left side of the road and have many roundabouts. We felt it was best to leave the driving to a local. We spent 10 safe days visiting scenic and wonderful places such as Hobbiton from the movie *The Hobbit* and *Lord of the Rings*, gardens, museums and native people cultural centers, all the time staying in both modern and vintage 4 and 5 star hotels.

New Zealand has a large amount of old car hobbyists.

Many of their cars are parked on the streets to our delight. In Martinbourgh, a 1924 Dodge Touring graced the front of the late 1800s Martinbourgh Hotel. In Napier, Hooter's Vintage Cars (midtwentys) tour this Art Deco city. I flagged down a Model T Ford passing by (to the delight of the owner) who insisted on driving me around town.

The Southward Museum (<u>fiadmin@southwards.co.nz</u>) was founded by Sir Leonard Southward. Sir Len was an avid motor enthusiast, automobile collector and New Zealand motor sport legend. The world-renowned Southward Car Museum houses the southern hemisphere's largest private car collection. The building also houses extensive conference and function facilities, a theatre (complete with operational pipe organ), a café and restaurant facilities - all of which are set in six hectares of park-like grounds. The museum itself is home to over 400 automobiles and various other exhibits including aircraft, bicycles, a range of vintage tools and other automobile memorabilia and even vintage fire engines.

They say "time passes quickly when you're having fun." Well, it flowed while in New Zealand. We found the people to be friendly and accommodating. Oh, if you go there, try the Hokey Pokie Ice







Cream.

The best part of this hobby is the people. We are only the custodians of the vehicles we own presently. Someday, when we get too old to drive them, they will move on to new loving families. But, we will still have the friendships and the memories of dear people. If it were not for our hosting of the Cleves 35 years ago, we would never had made the trip to New Zealand. What a shame that would have been!

Analysts point to huvers taking control increase in no-reserve

offerings, and a return to passion over profit.


The calendar is nice and neat and all, but it seems so arbitrary in assigning when one year ends and the new one begins. After all, there are national and religious calendars, even fiscal calendars, and each with its own rationale.

For some, especially those with a poetic bent, what signals a new year and optimistic new beginning are the first green shoots pushing through the warming soil or the first buds on the fruit trees.

For others, and especially for the collector car community, what signals the start of a new year is the arrival from Italy of no, not a new Ferrari or Fiat - but the *Classic Car Auction Yearbook*, with authors Adolfo Ori and Raffaele Gazzi setting the end of each year at the conclusion of the auction week on California's Monterey Peninsula.

When the last gavel has fallen on those sales, the authors, with underwriting support from Credit Suisse, launch into

crunching numbers and building charts and asking some experts to join them in reflecting on what has taken place in the collector car marketplace in the previous 12 months.




- Compared with previous-year figures, 26 percent more cars were offered a no reserve during 2016-17, and they comprised around 10 percent of all sales.
- Again compared to previous-year figures, the average sales price in 2016-17 fell 15 percent, but since we're talking the major sales, that figure was still \$254,000.
- It's one thing to compare the top sale of the year to previous years, but what about the car that was the 100th most expensive sold at auction? It sold for \$1.54 million, down \$110,000 from the previous year, and that was down from the peak of the previous two years.
- Ferrari seems to have lost part of its "sparkle," the authors note, comprising only 25 percent rather than its usual 30 percent of the overall top-end of the auction marketplace.
- On the other hand, Aston Martin, Lancia and Mercedes-Benz increased their market share.



Louise Bianchi Chiotti Memorial Scholarship Award

Louise (Bianchi) Chiotti was born on June 11, 1914 in San Jose California. The Family's first automobile was a 1926 Dodge Sedan. Her two younger brothers purchased a 1939 Studebaker and took delivery in January 1939. They wanted to give it to Louise's son Dave in 1956. His mother thought it too big of a car for a fifteen year old in San Francisco and talked him into buying a 1930 Model "A" Ford Coupe. In 1959 the little Ford was a bit slow, so Dave purchased a 1959 Ford convertible. As Dave sat on the running board of the Ford waiting for the new owner to arrive his mom came and sat next to him. "You really don't want to sell it do you?" she asked. "No, I don't was my reply." "Then don't," Mom said.

Dave and Marilyn Chiotti still own the Model "A"; it is a Senior and First Place Grand National Award Winner. The 1939 Studebaker came to the Chiottis after spending 40 years under a walnut tree. It is now a Senior and First Place Grand National Award Winner. The 1926 Dodge was cut into a truck for ranch use in the 1940's. Dave brought it home in 1976 and built a Woodie. In 2000, they donated it to Luther Burbank Home & Gardens in Santa Rosa. After Dave and Marilyn's uncle's passing, they acquired their 1968 Cadillac El Dorado. 

The Michael Kelly concern picked up the reins and ran it briefly, and then John J. Cafaro took over...moved it to Ohio...and operated Avanti through 1991.

Kelly then repurchased the firm in 1999, moved it from Ohio to Georgia, and struggled to continue into 2005. A year later, he moved the company to Mexico, and was then indicted for fraud.
