


That's a Wrap on Hershey Meet Week

A Buick with History

Helping out at the annual 2008 AACA Blue Water Region summer car show in Marysville, Michigan, Rudy Vernon and his wife Sharon spotted a real find for sale in the show. It was a 1936 Buick Model 61 two-door sedan with low mileage and original owner documented history. It didn't take long to recognize a rare find, so they bought the great old car.

Along with the original owner's manual, Rudy was handed a glove box log book written by the original owner Peter Aronson. It showed twenty-six years of consecutive maintenance and daily expenses recorded while living in Michigan's Upper Peninsula town of Escanaba. I mean every drop of gas, oil and every part put on the car was duly entered in the log book.

Peter always stored his car during Escanaba's severe winter, so he ordered the Buick built for himself without an oil filter or a heater. Maybe it wasn't all that unusual to order a car without a heater as the Buick dealer included a lap robe that usually hung "where else?" on the robe rail on the back of the front seat. That same lap robe survives today and is hanging there in the Buick waiting for a needy person on a chilly drive

It makes you wonder about Peter Aronson who was so dedicated to keeping the entire Buick's history in the glove box.

Here is what we know about our great record keeper Peter. He was born in 1868 in Sweden. His story is about leaving hard times in Sweden and sailing to America to fulfill all immigrants' dreams of a better life in the "New Country." Peter's older brother, David Aronson, was the first of his family to come to America. He came in 1879 and wrote to Peter of the many opportunities for all in Michigan with a climate not unlike that of Sweden.

Encouraged by those letters, Peter came with his younger brother Frank W. Aronson, who became a tailor in Escanaba. Peter and Frank sailed from Goteborg, Sweden, and landed in New York harbor on April 15, 1887, making him twenty years old and Frank only seventeen. It doesn't seem like Peter was old enough to have brought a trade with him, but his family and schooling in Sweden may have taught him enough to start a business in a strange land.

Let's see what we can find out about Peter in old Escanaba history. Searching our way through old documents, we find Peter on the 1900 Escanaba census listed with the occupation of "Shoe Maker." Ha! Now we know Peter did bring a trade with him from the old country. Continuing the search, the 1902 Escanaba business directory now showing Peter with a shoe store probably in a rented building at 910 Ludington. It tells us he is a "Dealer in Men's, Women's and Children Shoes, selected from the best Grades in the Market. Your Patronage is solicited."

The city directories can tell a good story as they change information each year. They can even show marriage clues as in the case of the 1910 directory showing Peter as the lone household member living above his place of business and then the 1913 one showing him with a spouse named "Freda M." All right, where did Freda M. come from? Now Sherlock Holmes would also have noticed in those directories about that same time that Peter had taken on a partner named Martin Anderson. Sure enough, if you search the 1910 Escanaba census for Martin Anderson you'll find him with a neighbor named Gustav Peterson from Sweden listed with a daughter named Freda M. then age 17. So Freda was originally Freda M. Peterson. You could think Freda went to the shoe store probably hoping to get a discount from her neighbor Martin Anderson and, while trying on shoes, she met Peter and the rest is history. This may be going a long way around the block telling the Buick's history, but it will tell us when and where the car served its owners right up to when Rudy and Sharon bought it.

Stay with me now. The 1920 Escanaba census shows Peter and Freda now with a son named Orvil Aronson, age 7. Orvil grew up and by 1933 he had followed his cousin down to the Lower Peninsula to attend college at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor. Here's where we are getting close to the reason for buying the new Buick in 1935.

Shortly after Orvil left for college, on Nov 4, 1935, the original title and glove box log tells us that the very frugal Peter decided to give up on the older 1928 Buick with a total of 23,262 miles and, with an additional \$1,042, he bought the new model 36-48 two-door Victoria Buick. The story passed on by the owners is that Peter would store his car maybe six months during



the winter. He didn't have a big need for a car since his home and business were at the same location. Peter never had to drive to work, so very few of the Buick's 48,600 miles over twenty years were logged in the small town of Escanaba. Common sense thinking tells us that Peter and Freda drove the 1936 Buick down to the Lower Peninsula to visit their only child Orvil - a trip of about 500 miles each way. That could account for the extra miles. Freda probably said something like, "Our new Buick even has roll up windows." Peter drove the car until 1956, but still owned it until his death in 1965.

When Peter died, his son Orvil (having married and moved to Grosse Point, Michigan) inherited the Buick. He drove it occasionally until finally his daughter drove the Buick to high school. The family

moved once again; this time to Saint Clair Michigan, only a short distance from where Rudy and Sharon bought the car.

Fate and good luck have decided that Rudy and Sharon Vernon are the care takers of the history and the beautiful old 1936 Buick. I believe Peter and Freda would be pleased to know of its survival and the Vernon's proud ownership of it.




Fall Meet Wrap-Up

1971 Fiat 850 Spider with "Loot in the Boot" Sold at RM Sotheby's Hershey Auction to Benefit AACA Library

During the Hershey Fall Meet, we benefited from the generosity of Wayne Carini, Ralph Marano, Joe Cassini and Rob Myers along with the gang at RM Sotheby's who supported us to the tune of \$34,000 for the week. The publicity that the club got and the strong message they have given AACA about their support of our mission cannot be underestimated.

To top it off, we had a lot of fun auctioning off the Fiat with the "Loot in the Boot." The Fiat was a 1971 Spider that was a donation and the trunk was full of cash - bidders had no idea how much though! After much cajoling and laughter caused by Ralph Marano, the car itself brought \$24,000! Thanks to everyone who had a hand in this highly entertaining event at the fall meet.







Show-Stopping American Classics From Thomas F. Derro Collection Lead RM Sotheby's \$15.9 Million Hershey Sale

RM Sotheby's once again celebrated the American automobile at Hershey Lodge during the world-renowned AACA Fall Meet with \$15,932,802 in total sales and an incredible 96 percent sell-through rate across two days (5-6 October). Representing one of the company's top Hershey performances to date in the sale's eleven-year history, results were driven by bidders from 20 countries, and highlighted by several important private collections presented amongst the 140 cars on offer.

The Thomas F. Derro Collection, one of the Northeast's greatest collections of American automobiles, offered entirely without reserve, stole the show on Friday evening, with many lots achieving or exceeding estimates. Drawing tremendous pre-sale interest, the twelve-car Derro

Collection was led by the 1933 Pierce-Arrow Silver Arrow, the very first of just four examples and a mere three survivors, which brought a final \$2,310,000 following an extended contest between bidders in the room and on the phone. Additional highly anticipated highlights from the Derro Collection include an exceptionally restored, award-winning 1935 Duesenberg Model J Cabriolet with one-off European coachwork by d'leteren, which sold for \$1,485,000, a striking 1957 Dual-Ghia Convertible with the optional D500 Hemi V-8 engine which well-exceeded expectations at \$341,000 (Est. \$200k/250k), and a 1941 Packard Custom

Super Eight One Eighty Convertible Victoria, used in the popular 1970s NBC television series "Banacek", which brought a strong \$407,000.

"The RM Sotheby's Hershey auction remains one of the premier destinations for die-hard Classic and Brass era enthusiasts and the results over the course of the two-day auction simply reaffirmed the strength of the market and depth of the consignments for this year's stellar offering," said Gord Duff, Global Head of Auctions for RM Sotheby's, following the sale. "Headlined by notable estate collections; The Thomas F. Derro and Ralph Whitworth Collections respectively, RM Sotheby's was honored to have been chosen to represent such esteemed names in the hobby. It goes to show that the mix between cars with outstanding provenance against the backdrop of our annual Hershey sale continues to provide the recipe for sweet success".

Stand-out American Classics of exceptional provenance also shone outside of the private collections. Thursday evening saw a 1936 Cadillac V-16 Convertible Sedan by Fleetwood, one of the very finest first generation examples extant, bring a well-deserved \$715,000. Sympathetically restored from an outstanding original example, the V-16 was exhibited for six decades at Chicago's Museum of Science and Industry and came to Hershey having had just two private owners since 1949. On Friday, an authentic, factory-supercharged 1937 Cord 812 Supercharged Cabriolet delighted the packed auction room when it reached a final \$412,500 following interest from multiple parties (Est. \$300k/350k).

Proving that collectors are willing to pay strong money for the truly special cars at all levels of the market, one of the most anticipated and most unique lots of the Thursday sale was the iconic 1937 White Model 706 Yellowstone Park Tour Bus. Originally supplied to Yellowstone National Park and now upgraded for modern enjoyment, the ultimate party bus ignited a fierce competition between nearly 20 bidders on the phone and in the room, smashing its presale estimate at a final \$165,000 (Est. \$30k/40k). On Friday evening, an immaculately restored, Canadian-delivery 1961 AMC Metropolitan 1500 Convertible

also charmed its way past high estimate, attracting a bidding contest that eventually saw it sold at \$74,250 (Est. \$30k/40k).

Louise Bianchi Chiotti Memorial Scholarship Award

Louise (Bianchi) Chiotti was born on June 11, 1914 in San Jose California. The Family's first automobile was a 1926 Dodge Sedan. Her two younger brothers purchased a 1939 Studebaker and took delivery in January 1939. They wanted to give it to Louise's son Dave in 1956. His mother thought it too big of a car for a fifteen year old in San Francisco and talked him into buying a 1930 Model "A" Ford Coupe. In 1959 the little Ford was a bit slow, so Dave purchased a 1959 Ford convertible. As Dave sat on the running board of the Ford waiting for the new owner to arrive his mom came and sat next to him. "You really don't want to sell it do you?" she asked. "No, I don't was my reply." "Then don't," Mom said.

Dave and Marilyn Chiotti still own the Model "A"; it is a Senior and First Place Grand National Award Winner. The 1939 Studebaker came to the Chiottis after spending 40 years under a walnut tree. It is now a Senior and First Place Grand National Award Winner. The 1926 Dodge was cut into a truck for ranch use in the 1940's. Dave brought it home in 1976 and built a Woodie. In 2000, they donated it to Luther Burbank Home & Gardens in Santa Rosa. After Dave and Marilyn's uncle's passing, they acquired their 1968 Cadillac El Dorado. It now lives in the AACA Museum in Hershey, PA. This \$1,500 scholarship is based upon the same rules as the AACA Automotive Technology Award and is awarded as funds are available. It was instituted and funded by Dave and Marilyn Chiotti as a way to honor Louise and a way to continue to support youth in the hobby. 
